Dear Client,

As the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Pearl Harbor approaches, we want to keep you updated on conditions (including any ongoing restrictions), protocols and policies with even more frequency.

On Friday, October 1<sup>st</sup>, the Governor of Hawaii extended the current restrictions on gatherings until December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021. Additionally, we were informed late last week that Hanger 79 needs immediate emergency repair on the roof which may, or may not be completed by December. Hanger 79 was a maintenance and engine repair facility that withstood the December 7, 1941 attack on Pearl Harbor, as evidenced by the blue glass windows riddled with bullet holes left by the battle. Maintaining the structure and integrity of this building is imperative. At this time, we are making plans to accommodate these current restrictions and repairs but remain hopeful that this could change by our arrival in Hawaii.

Due to the limitation on gatherings indoors, we are setting-up two outside tented areas at the Aviation Museum for our Concert Series to Commemorate the 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Pearl Harbor. With current outdoor gathering restrictions, we are allowed to have a maximum of 25 musicians/singers in groups separated by 6 feet of social distancing. For example, if you have a group of 50 musicians/singers, we are allowed to have two groups of 25 with 6 feet in between each group. Performing groups will have a space of approximately 30x40 feet for the full ensemble. Instrumental groups will be provided chairs in sections of 25 musicians. Choirs will have two sections of choral platforms, separated by 6 feet.

Due to these current restrictions, the Aviation Museum is going to bring the museum exhibits to the outside areas, around the performance spaces. This will include having planes and exhibits placed all around the performing areas so patrons and visitors can enjoy these historic aircrafts while listening to the inspiring music you are sharing as part of this very historic anniversary.

We feel confident that we can accommodate these restrictions while also remaining committed to honoring this historical event. We are aware of how much planning, fundraising, rehearsing and excitement exists for your groups and we are committed to seeing this is the memorable and life-changing experience everyone is anticipating it to be. The value and reputation of MCI is that we can turn challenging situations into successful opportunities for everyone involved. We feel confident you will experience this during your time in Hawaii and we are committed to keeping you informed with more details as we move forward.

We are looking forward to celebrating this momentous occasion together. Aloha and see you in Hawaii!
